The Lion- Long Suffering (Patience)

Cool Stats:

Animal Connection:

A female lion usually hunts for her pride, or family group. Much of the hunting time is spent stalking-hiding in the grass, waiting for her prey to come near. A female lion cannot run at top speed for very long, so she waits until her prey is nearby before she attacks. She uses patience to catch the food for her family.

Fruit of the Spirit Connection:

Proverbs 14:29 says that patience is important for us too. God wants us to be patient with each other. When other people do things that make us impatient, we might yell, hit or fight. But instead we can ask God for patience. God tells us that to be people who have understanding we need patience. This week— work on patience!
